
Most importantly you need to have a plan and prepare.

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The "WHAT IF" Questions Common questions "What IF THIS happens what should I do?" What IF THAT happens then what should I do?" There is no way to anticipate every possibility. That is why you must prepare and have OPTIONS!




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

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If you see Something Say Something

- In 81% of incidents, at least one other person had some prior knowledge of the attacker's plan.
 (US Secret Service)
 - In 59% of incidents, more than one person had some knowledge.

Does your organization have an anonymous tip line?

If you see Something, Say Something - Suspicious vehicle in lot - "Scoping" place out - testing security (Employee or unknown threat) - A person questions about a building's operations, security procedures and/or personnel, shift changes, etc. - Threats - Called in or Written - Physical (doors chained shut, explosives, video cameras, door brackets) - Someone entering with layers of clothing on, concealing a gun 77 % of attackers spent a week on longer planning attack - Suppose the stack Behaven and Active Shoders in the United States between 2000-203)

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Situational Awareness

- What if you could predict that an event is about to take place and be one step ahead as the event unfolds? Would be nice, wouldn't it?
- Paying attention to your surroundings or "situational awareness" increases your response time to safely handle an unexpected event.
- Know what is going on around you.



Don't Name them



Some shooters are motivated by a desire for fame, notoriety, and/or recognition.

fame, notoriety, and/or recognition.

*When the media focuses on the shooter, they provide this fame, notoriety and recognition.

*This focus allows the shooter to accomplish one of his goals, and validates his life and actions.

*Media coverage can create a contagion effect producing more shootings.

*Some shootings may be prevented by removing one of the incentives.

*We encourage the media and others not to name the shooters or focus on their lives.

*The shooters should be as unrecognized in their death as at they were in their lives.

*Media coverage should focus on the victims and the heroes.

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What is an "Active Assailant"?

"An Active Assailant is an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area, in most cases, active assailants use frearms(s) and there is no pattern or method to their selection of victims." Accordigional US Department of Homeland Society.



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Why Is Preparation Necessary? TIME is critical!

An average Active Assailant event lasts



4 - 8 minutes

Over 70% of incidents are over in 5 min or less

What is the average time for Law Enforcement to arrive?

3 - 6 minutes *This is a National Average

Why Is Preparation Necessary? Goal of An Active Assailant: Active Assailants are there to kill, even at the cost of their own life! Their goal is to cause as much carnage as possible! Active Assailants have no intention of negotiating! Killer mindset is "maximum lethality = power"! Our Primary Goal: SURVIVAL! How can you make yourself a harder target?

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







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




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How Are People Warned?

If you have an ALERT system

- ✓ Does all your staff have access to use it?
- Does all your staff know how to use it?
- ✓Do you test it to see if it works?
- Does it go to all locations (outdoors, bathrooms, locker room, break room, etc.)?
- ✓ Can you hear ALERT if loud working environment?
 ✓ Is it 2 way communication?
- √Can they communicate information back?
- Can you alert staff not on site and families of your staff?
- Can you communicate with other tenants?



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




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


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-Get in a room and Lock/Secure doors -Or Designated Shelter in Place Areas -Barricade door for additional security (DELAY THREAT) -Look for secondary exit out of room Do not open the door, Law Enforcement will clear building escort/direct you out!

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HIDE

-If you cannot get behind a closed door or out of building hide in an area out of the assailant's view

•Silence your cell phone, no talking, and lights off (shut blinds)

 Prepare to fight if the threat enters the room



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

It's important to remember that your building has become a crime scene.

It's important that your organization's active shooter preparedness planning involves your HR department so that they can identify additional resources to support employees after an active shooter event. PTSD may trigger months after event.

- Certain sites, smells, sounds trigger PTSD
- Survivors guilt
- Shock and Nightmares

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OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- •Do you have a way to communicate with employees post incident?
 •Are your Emergency contacts updated?
- •Can you access employee contact info remotely?
- •Can you continue with business as usual?
- •Do you have resources for post incident emotional and mental health support?
